SB 149 - Teacher and student success act passed - local school board will determine usage. 25% for teacher wages. 25% to the schools

Trustland Funding - about 10% more than this year

NetSmartz Funding - Additional funding available to the state. Possible nighttime presentation for parents.

Plan for next year: Due April 10?

GOAL #1 Interventions

- 7% of below proficient students will become proficient (Goal increased from 5% in 2017-18.)
 - Identify students place in 95% group
 - Screened for placement
 - Screened for progress
 - Instructional Assitant funding \$17,000

GOAL #2 Additional 1/2 day Kindergarten session

- Add another ¹/₂ day Kindergarten class.
- 0.5 FTE to reduce class sizes to 17 students
- In order to have funding from the district, we need an additional 20 students.
- Focus on Kindergarten to provide earlier interventions
 - FUNDING: \$45,000

GOAL #3 - Math

- Math achievement
 - Aides \$11,2000

- IXL \$4,200 Drills that level for each student. "Amazing program." Teachers can set lessons based on each student's needs. Tied to core requirements
- One Chromebook lab for Math Interventions. \$8,400

(Jamie suggested looking into providing push-in Math aides for 1st and 2nd grades.)

Goal # 4 -

- Playworks program
- Check and Connect person
 - Many criteria used to identify children
 - Works with individuals

BUDGET

Projected Distribution 101,039

FUNDING CHANGES: Additional or alternative funding would be used for additional aide time.

Voting on the plan was unanimous.

The district Technology department has offered us an additional Chromebook lab - Mr. Barker has accepted

 - Working to provide more structure
 - Day broken down into 30-minute sections. Half-hour prep and either 95% or Math push-in for the remainder of the day.
