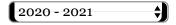

- 1. Based on BOY Acadience scores, we will identify which students are below proficiency.
- 2. Those students will be screened for placement in the 95% group literacy intervention.
- 3. Based on that screening, students will be placed into the appropriate intervention group that will target their deficiencies.
- 4. Periodic assessments will be given to monitor progress.
- 5. Final results will be tallied using the EOY Acadience scores.
- 6. Instructional Assistants will be hired to run the 95% group intervention

## Please explain how the action plan was implemented to reach this goal.

After the BOY Acadience test, we found those students that needed some help through interventions. We hired several instructional assistants to help run our 95% intervention group. These groups were adjusted throughout the year according to the periodic assessments given.

## This is the Action Plan Steps identified in the plan to reach the goal.

In the past, we offered 5 sections of Kindergarten with an average class size of about 21 students. The plan is to add one more section of Kindergarten by increasing funding another 0.5 FTE to reduce those class sizes down to 17 students. We have been told in the planning meeting with our Human Resources dept. that there wouldn't be a funding increase for this need unless total school enrollment increases by about 20 students over the summer.

If enrollment does increase and the district ends up funding this need, we will hire Instructional Assistants to help in the classrooms.

We paid for an additional 0.5 FTE to keep our Kindergarten classes smaller.

### This is the Action Plan Steps identified in the plan to reach the goal.

- 1. Each grade level will assess each student to determine placement into appropriate intervention groups.
- 2. Grade level teams will determine numbers and types of groups needed (i.e. computer based intervention, small group instruction, classroom aides, etc.)
- 3. We will use IXL (computer based math progam) to provide one form of intervention. IXL licenses will need to be purchased.
- 4. Instructional Assistants will be hired to help during intervention time.
- 5. Intervention strategies will be implemented.
- 6. Continuous assessment will take place to determine growth and needs.
- 7. Intervention groups will be adjusted as needed.
- 8. Another step to achieve our goal is to reduce poor behavior that results in lost classroom instruction time. If a student isn't in class, they can't learn. We have noticed that many lost hours are due to problems coming from the playground. To counter this we will enter into a contract with Playworks.
- 9. The administration will collaborate with an onsite Playworks recess expert to train and instruct the playground supervisors and classroom teachers.
- 10. An onsite coordinator will teach, model, and empower a sustainable recess program for one week each month during the school year.
- 11. Student leadership will be cultivated through the Junior Coach program.
- 12. Data will be gathered from our Life Skills Room to determine what effect the program is having on our students.

- 1. The at risk students will be identified by teachers and administration at the start of the school year.
- 2. We will continue to pay for a Check and Connect Mentor to meet with those students.
- 3. The Check and Connect mentor will monitor the progress and be a support to the student. These mentors will also make connections with the home as needed. It is our hope that by supporting the students with the

most needs, the achievement gap will be closed and we will see improvement.

- 4. Check and Connect mentors will meet weekly with at risk students.
- 5. The Check and Connect mentors will meet with the grade level teachers to see where support is needed.
- 6. Home visits or phone calls will be made as needed.
